# Rising 3's



#### This summer term, our topic has been all about 'Minibeasts' and 'Under the Sea'.

We've had so much fun exploring these themes through a wide range of exciting activities and games. The children learned about different minibeasts, their habitats, and the changing seasons. We also discovered fascinating sea creatures and explored life at the beach—including boats, floating and sinking, pirates, and ships.

We enjoyed sharing lots of lovely stories and nursery rhymes, including some of our favourites like *Incy Wincy Spider*, *Five Little Speckled Frogs*, *Row, Row, Row Your Boat*, and many more.

Creative play was a big part of our learning. The children used a variety of textures and materials in their artwork—painting, printing, using brushes, experimenting with shaving foam, and gluing and sticking.














This term, we enjoyed exploring *Elmer the Elephant*, the colourful patchwork elephant who celebrates being different. Through his adventures, the children learned about kindness, individuality, and the importance of accepting others. We are so proud of our Early Years garden area this term. The children have been amazing throughout the process. They helped to plant the seeds, water the plants and once grown, we harvested and tasted our own produce. The children all knew how to be careful and enjoyed being little gardeners. Well done, everyone!



















This half term, we have continued with our topic "All Creatures Great and Small" and we have been very busy! The children have enjoyed learning about minibeasts and life cycles. We were lucky enough to go on a minibeast hunt at Whitfield Valley Nature Reserve and also took part in a pond dipping activity. Not only have the children explored their locality, they have also found out all about animals from different habitats such as the desert, the grasslands and the polar regions! The children enjoyed finding out lots of facts! Towards the end of the term, they had a brilliant time at Blue Planet Aquarium learning about the marine life – even a great big shark, called Betty and Nemo!






















We have really focused on our use of phonics this half term and using them to write words, captions and sentences. The children have had a range of things to write about from labels to animal descriptions.








In design and technology, Year 2 have been exploring the different food groups and learning about the importance of a healthy, balanced diet. The children discussed the nutritional value of various foods and identified which groups contribute to overall wellbeing. Building on this knowledge, they carefully tasted a variety of ingredients, considering flavours and textures, before selecting their favourites to create their own personalised wraps. This practical activity not only reinforced their understanding of healthy eating but also encouraged creativity and decision-making. The children thoroughly enjoyed the experience and took pride in their delicious, nutritious creations.















#### **Sports Day Success!**

Year 3 enjoyed a fantastic morning of fun and competition at their annual Sports Day, with parents and children alike getting involved in the action. The children took on the hurdles, 100m sprints, sack race, and an exciting relay race. Parents also showed great spirit and enthusiasm in their own race, much to the delight of the crowd! It was a closely contested event, with all house teams earning plenty of points, but in the end, Aquila soared into first place, closely followed by Scorpius. The day was perfectly rounded off with a well-deserved ice lolly for all the children!

#### Marvellous Maths

This term, Year 3 have been working hard to understand the value of money, learning how to use pounds and pence with confidence. They've also been telling the time, focusing on the difference between quarter past and quarter to – even using Roman numerals to help read the clock!











This half term, Year 3 have been showcasing their artistic talents by exploring both realism and abstract art. They focused on monochromatic pieces and experimented with using texture to highlight key features in their portraits, creating some truly impressive work!





#### Saving the Bees

In Geography, Year 3 explored the importance of protecting our bee population. They investigated the key issues causing the decline in bees and discussed practical ways they could help save them. This was a wonderfully engaging topic, and the children showed real passion and enthusiasm for the sustainability of bees and the environment.







#### Wonderful Writing

Year 3 continued their exciting writing journey by revisiting the evil witch from *Hansel and Gretel*. The children wrote imaginative recount-biographies from the witch's perspective, detailing her horrific crimes over the years! This creative piece not only showcased their storytelling skills but also focused on using apostrophes for possession with confidence.







#### **Exploring the Wonders of Science!**


Year 3 had a fantastic time at the Thinktank Science Museum! There were smiles all around as the children explored the interactive science garden, journeyed through the past in the museum's fascinating exhibitions, and looked ahead to the future through the exciting world of AI.





In our English lessons, we have been learning how to use direct speech in our writing. We have linked this closely with previous learning about Mount Vesuvius, its eruption and the destruction of Pompeii. To ensure that we could immerse ourselves in the whole process, we have watched reenacted clips of the event, performed our own drama, had many discussions, worked collaboratively and drafted our work before our final write up. We have thoroughly enjoyed the whole process and are proud of the work we've produced!





In our maths lessons, we have been learning about shape and statistics!





We really appreciate your ongoing support with times tables and encourage you to support the children with this as much as possible at home to ensure rapid progress is made.



In science, we have been learning all about sound. We have learnt how the ear works, how sound travels and factors that could affect this process. We have used tuning forks to create sound and created larger pinnae to test if this changes the volume of sound we receive. We also made our very own panpipes to learn about pitch, which included some careful measuring and cutting skills.








We have been lucky enough to attend the Halle event at the Victoria Hall, which we all thoroughly enjoyed!

As a school, we thoroughly enjoyed participating in the Stoke 100 celebrations. We then went on to look at the Maya civilisation who lived in what is modern day Mexico and the surrounding area. We had to use our knowledge of the Anglo-Saxons to help us compare societies that existed at the same time.



All of Year 5 were lucky enough to be invited to the design and technology department at Haywood Academy to make a summer puzzle out of wood.

They had an hour to make their puzzle and Miss Abbott was super impressed with how well the children worked and the quality of what they produced. All of the children thoroughly enjoyed their visit. This was also an opportunity for the children to see what facilities were on offer at high school as they prepare to move to Year 6 and make their high school choices.













Music this term has been delivered by Mrs Hollingshurst. The children have been learning to play the ukulele and even had the chance to go to Victoria Hall to take part in the Big Play where children from all over Stoke-on-Trent took part. It has been great listening to the children attempt to play the chords to accompany modern day pop songs. As well as learning to play the ukulele, the children have also had the opportunity to use modern technology to compose pieces of music which reflect different moods and pieces of art.

Sports day was a great success and the children all gave it their absolute best. They really appreciated the support from the huge number of parents who turned up to cheer them on.

P.E this term has focused on fielding games with a particular focus on rounders. It took quite a bit of time to understand the rules but we certainly have some big hitters in the year group. 














#### **Attendance**



welcome everyone back in September!















### Find a cosy spot and enjoy these book recommendations from some of our teachers!

From a girl who can't stop being rude, to a boy who is so greedy he eats EVERYTHING, these kids will make you laugh at their wild adventures."












#### For years 3 & 4, Mrs Wellington says:
